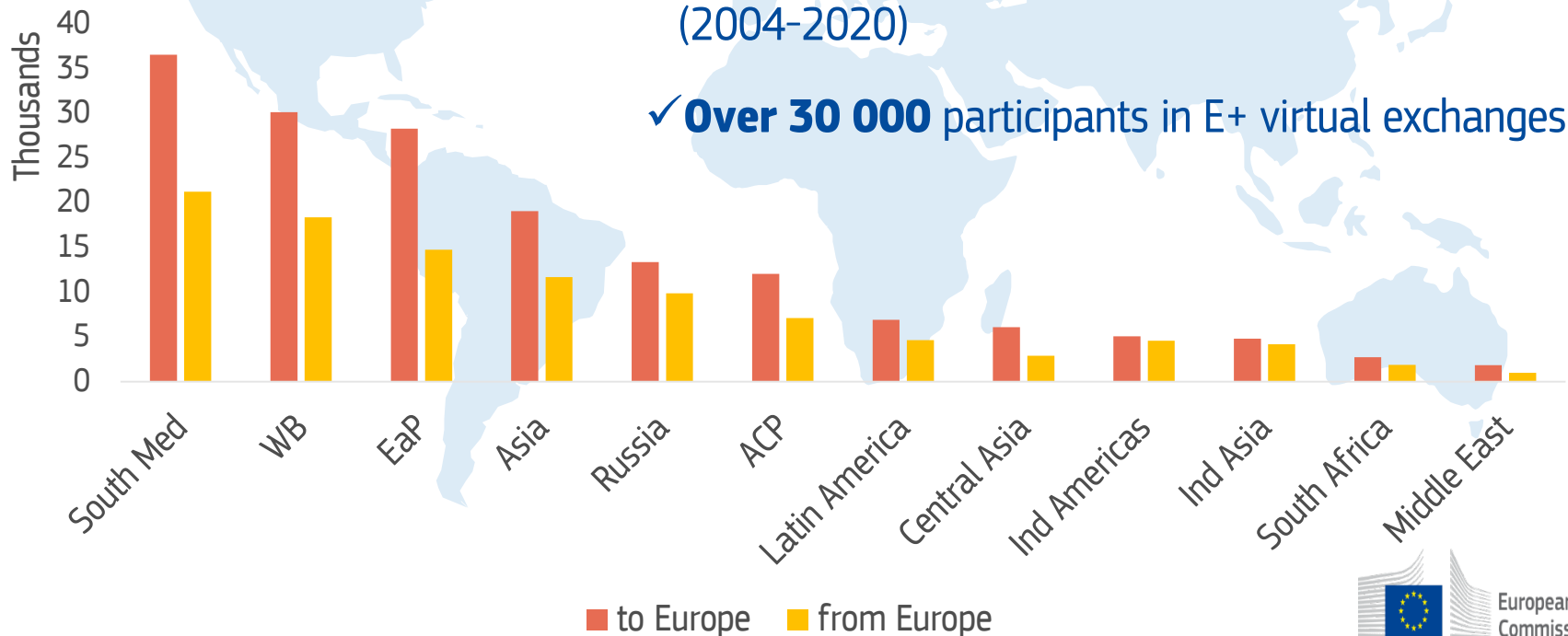

# What is Erasmus+?

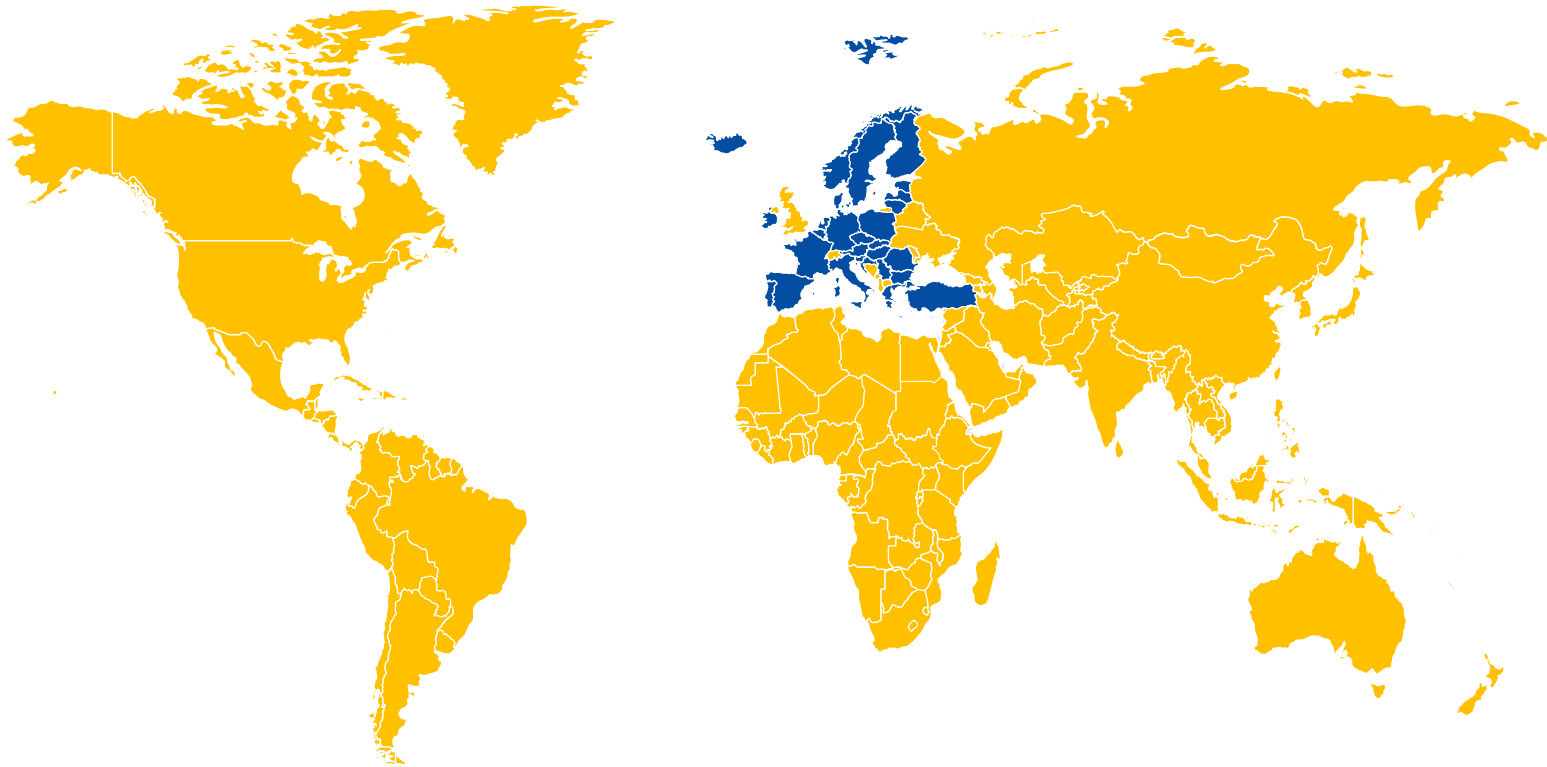
- The EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport
- Funding for programmes, projects and scholarships
- Fosters EU-EU and EU-international cooperation
- Erasmus+ 2021-2027:
  - builds on previous programme 2014-2020
  - more international

# International dimension of Erasmus+ 2014-2020 in key figures

- ✓ **~270 000** planned short-term staff and student mobilities
- ✓ **250** excellent integrated Master courses funded
- ✓ **24 500** Erasmus Mundus scholarships awarded (2004-2020)
- ✓ **Over 30 000** participants in E+ virtual exchanges

countries**

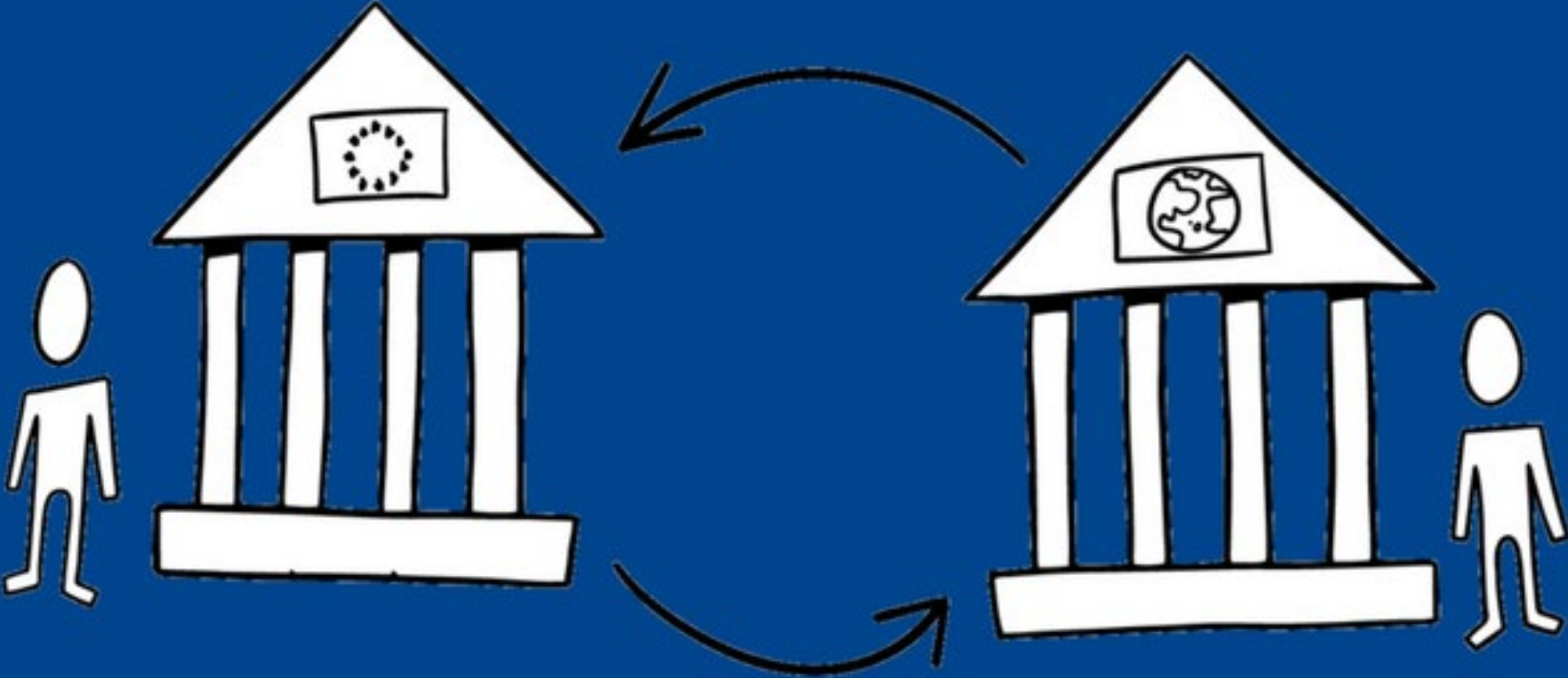
# Higher education opportunities for people from outside Europe

- International credit mobility scholarships
  - Short-term studies in Europe that will count to your degree back home
- Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters scholarships
  - A full degree programme at Master level, with study at two or more universities

# The benefits

- A unique learning experience in Europe
- Receive double/multiple/joint degree, or recognition of your study abroad
- In-depth knowledge of Europe and its higher education system
- Improved linguistic skills, intercultural experience
- Better employability
- Academic exchange of knowledge, ideas, contacts

# Credit mobility in brief

- Short-term studies in Europe that will count to your degree back home
- Mobility for Bachelor, Master and Doctoral students – and for staff
- Blended mobility with physical mobility period of 5 – 30 days
- Study or traineeship period of 2-12 months
- Grant for travel and subsistence

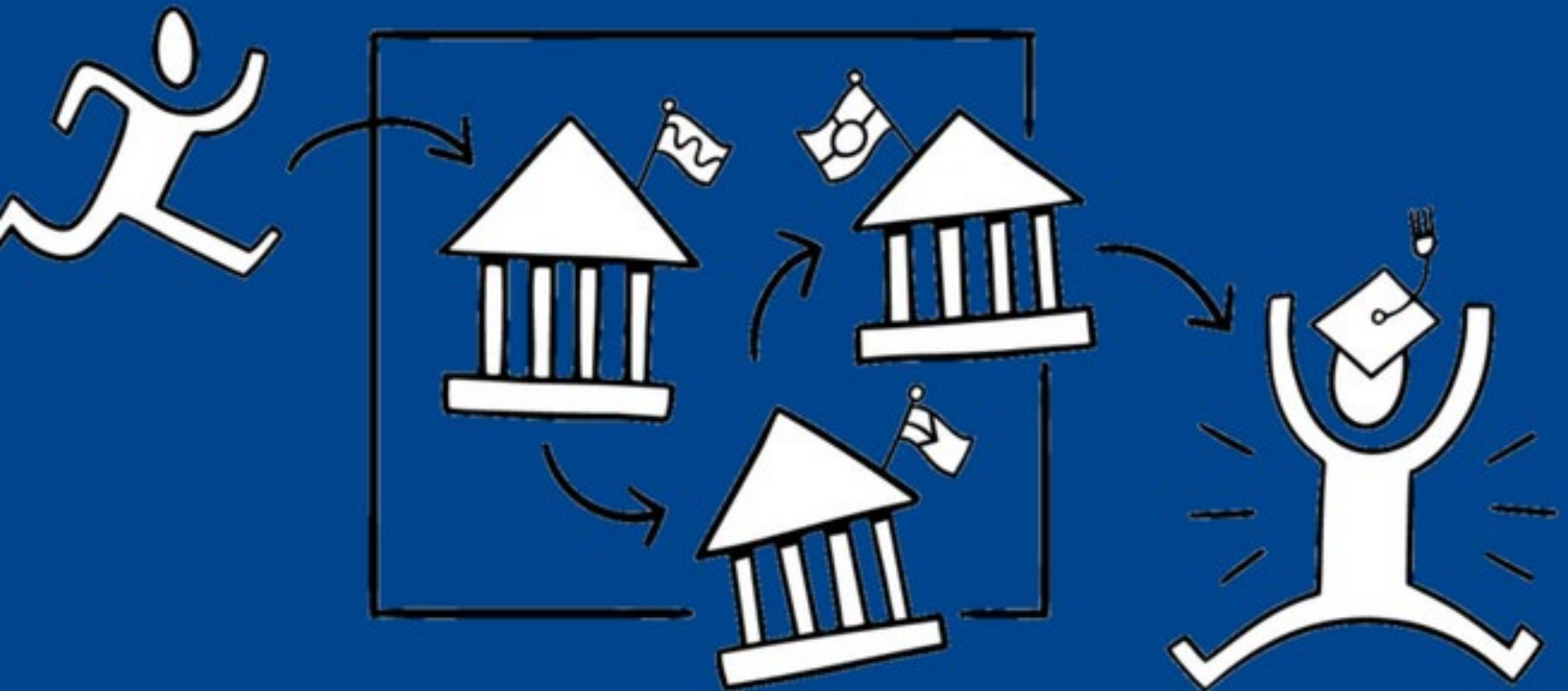


# Credit mobility: how to apply

- Contact your own university's international relations office to see:
  - which agreements it has
  - which study programmes are open for mobility

You can only take part if your university has an Erasmus+ agreement with a university in Europe.

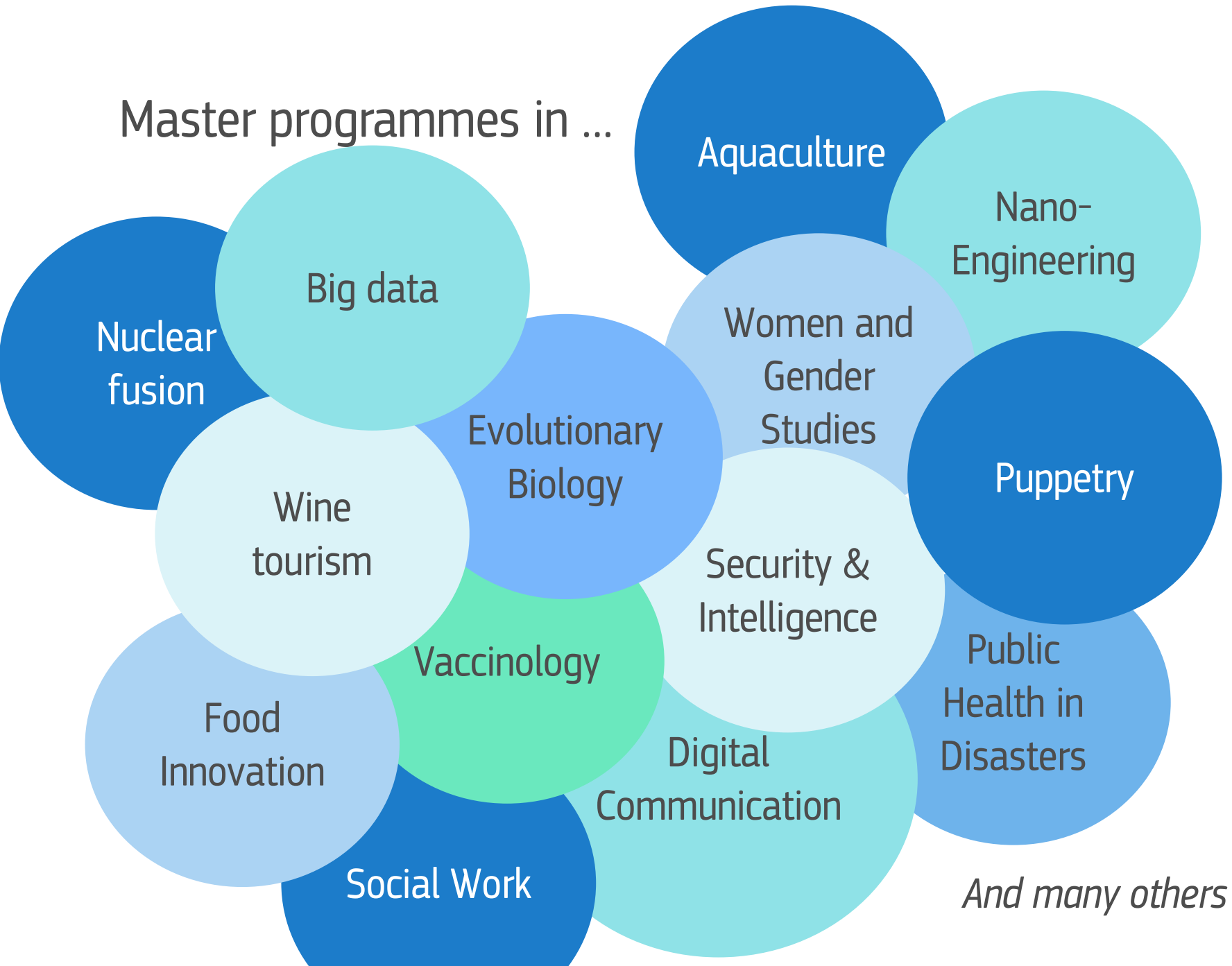

- Choose from a list of 149 Masters courses

# How to apply for a scholarship

- Each Masters programme selects its students
  - Check the catalogue of masters courses
  - Apply directly to the course
  - Application period: late 2021-early 2022 for programmes starting in September 2022

Anyone can apply: in final year of bachelors or later.  
No age limits – you can apply even if you have been working.

# Check the application requirements, e.g.:

- Eligibility
- Academic record; experience
- Language abilities
- Motivation – sell yourself!
- References
- Administrative documents
- **DEADLINES !**

# Languages?

- Vast majority of Master courses are taught in English, but...
- Whatever the language of instruction, it is important to have the right level of linguistic ability, and...
- You'll also have the chance to enroll in tailor-made language courses. These add to your skills and improve your employability

# Successful?

- Prepare your visa requests/other administrative procedures
- Ensure you have all the necessary documents ready well in advance (originals, certified copies)
- Check your rights and obligations in the student agreement
- Ask advice and support from fellow students who have already benefited from an EM scholarship (see EMA website)
